Ansel Dunham Lecture

Following the submission of six excellent nominations, voting by the Papers subcommittee and endorsement by the main EIG committee, Adrian Charters has been chosen to present this year's prestigious lecture on the opening day of the conference.

As a Chartered Geologist, Adrian has been closely involved with EIG since the late 1980s, serving on the organising committee since 1989 and acting as Chairman of the 2006 conference in Edinburgh. After graduating in 1984 in Industrial Mineralogy (MSc) from the University of Hull, where he was taught by Ansel and Peter Scott, he has worked for quarry operators (on both sides of the Atlantic) and for leading consultancies in the UK. Recently semi retired he remains as a Principal Associate with Land & Minerals Consulting Ltd.

The topic of his lecture will be based on his experience over 40 years on the evolution of the digital geologist from paper analogue to Al.







Papers




The Call for Papers for 2024, which expired on the 5th of January, produced an excellent response, as always. The 'Papers' subcommittee has since gone through the submitted abstracts and expressions of interest and has compiled a full programme of

prospective presentations. Individual authors will be contacted by members of the sub-committee during January to confirm whether or not their papers have been accepted and to assist them in fitting their suggestions into the various themes that have emerged. As with previous conferences, there will be a mixture of plenary and parallel sessions, this time covering a total of 10 different themes, as follows:







- Optimisation of mineral extraction
- Practical methods of achieving Net Zero in the minerals sector;
- Climate Change Adaptation for the minerals industry
- The role of quarries in Local Nature Recovery Strategies
- 'Back to Basics' workshop for early career extractive industry geologists
- Quarry design Case Studies
- Mineral Resources in the UK
- Marine and Coastal sand & gravel extraction
- Innovative methods of Waste Reduction
- Professional Practice in the minerals industry (including commercial, safety, ESG and professional insurance issues)

For the traditionalists amongst you, topics such as 'Geotechnics', 'Hydrogeology', 'Restoration' and 'Geodiversity', which have been a main stay of previous conferences, will still be covered, but within the context of these forward-looking, integrated themes. Further details of the content of each of the sessions will be revealed in the next newsletter.

Following feedback from the previous Exeter EIG conference we are in the process of finalising a new online registration system with information on how to register to follow over the coming months.

Field Trips



As always, an exciting programme of field trips is being planned on the Tuesday before and the Friday after the conference.

Details of these are still being finalised but will hopefully include visits to an operational North Sea aggregate dredger; historic and modern Chalk extraction sites; a clay pit and tile factory; a sand & gravel operation; a Magnesian Limestone quarry and Drax Power Station though others are being explored.









Scholarships



Finally, take up of the EIG Scholarship has declined over recent years and so it will be undergoing a revamp. The new scholarship funds will initially be used to provide a bursary to enable attendance at the Hull Conference to those who would otherwise be unable The intention is to focus financial support to geologists looking to return to work after a career break and students nearing graduation looking to pursue a career in the extractive industries. It is hoped that this will enable them to gain the networking opportunities and exposure to the diverse range of topics to be delivered and discussed at the conference. Depending on uptake of this we will also be looking to fund student bursaries to aid with the cost of university education.
