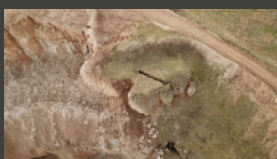

A One Day EIG Technical Meeting Quarry and surface mine geotechnics

19 June 2019, Stratford Manor Hotel, Warwickshire

Following previous successful one Day Technical Meetings on Rockfall, Ground and Surface Water, and Exploration in 2013, 2015 and 2017. This meeting, which will be a CPD day, will be held in the Stratford Manor Hotel on the Warwick-Stratford Road just south of the M40 Junction 15.

This Year's Topic

Having covered most of the major topics of concern to practitioners in the extractive industry we are this year returning to geotechnics. We aim to cover legislation and state of the art practice and developments and to consider in detail the Regulations, their adequacy and implementation in practice. This is a meeting that should appeal to many geoscientists in the extractive

sector and other interested professionals.

Speakers will include Cath Pickett (HSE), Prof John Coggan (CSM), Dr Alan Cobb (GWP Consultants), Thomas Clifford (WS Atkins) and others from the industry. Fuller programme details will be posted in early March.

Arrangements

The event has been designed around an anticipated attendance of 90 to 100, similar to the number attending in 2015. The cost will be £95 per person including lunch and refreshments. Limited accommodation (at extra cost) will be available on the evening of 26 June to be booked when the booking form is available. CPD certificates will be provided



for those who attend.

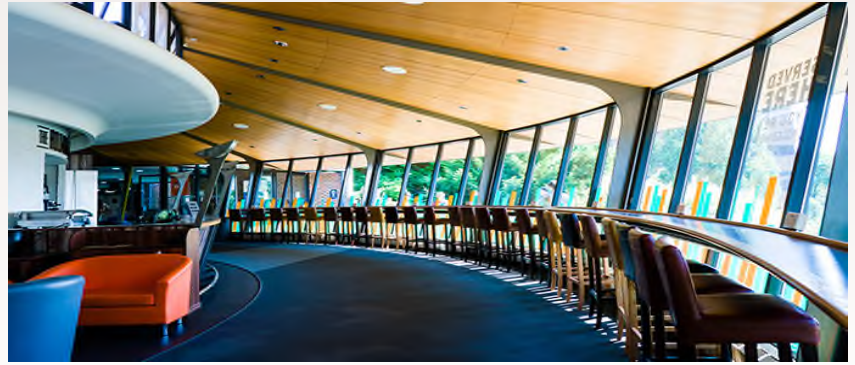

Dates: 8th to 11th July 2020

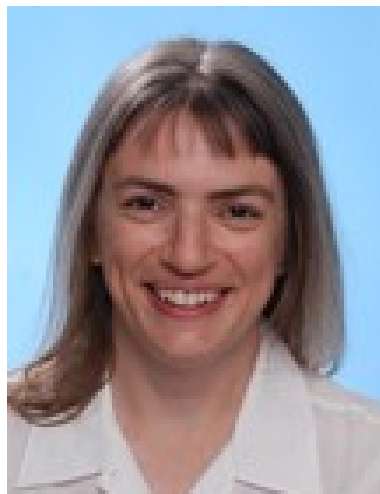
Venue: Peter Chalk Centre, Streatham Campus, University of Exeter
