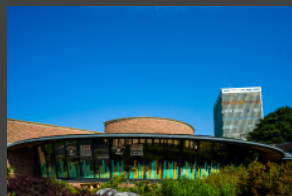

Announcement of speaker for the Ansel Dunham Memorial Lecture

The organising committee are delighted to announce that the Ansel Dunham Memorial Lecture at EIG 2020 will be delivered by Dr Karen Hanghøj, the new Director of the British Geological Survey.

Karen holds a PhD in Geology from the University of Copenhagen and has conducted extensive research on geological processes in the lower crust and mantle and their associated mineral deposits. During her career, she has been the Head of the Economic Geology at the Geological

Department of Petrology and Survey of Denmark and Greenland and CEO of EIT Raw Materials (a knowledge and innovation community supported by the European Institute of Innovation and Technology). She has also worked as a consultant to the minerals exploration industry, has been involved with numerous international Advisory Boards and Steering Groups, and spent more than 10 years in the USA as a researcher at the Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution and Columbia University.

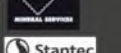
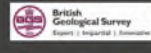

Student Poster Competition

At the 2020 Extractive Industry Geology Conference there will be a Student Poster Competition – this is open to anyone currently studying a geoscience subject at a UK university and we require your help to ensure as many students are aware of this as possible.

Students have the opportunity to write a 250 word abstract on a subject related to their studies that particularly interests them or they think would work well on a poster. No new research is required for this (unless they want to of course), so if they wish to use a past or current piece of work such as their project or thesis they are more than welcome. Abstracts are required to be sent to Stuart Kightley (skightley@googlemail.com) by the 31st March 2020.

A small panel made up of industry professionals will then choose the 5 best abstracts and invite the student to design and print their posters and attend the EIG 2020 Conference (attendance fees will be paid for) where their poster will be displayed.

At the conference each student will get 5 minutes to present their poster before the EIG audience who will then vote for their favourite, the student gaining the most votes will receive a £100 prize!

As well as the opportunity to win the prize, this gives all students a deeper understanding of an industry they may wish to work in; the opportunity to meet representatives of the industry (and potential future employers); the chance to improve their professional profile and CV and finally the enjoyment of meeting likeminded people!
