
The organising committee has been in touch with all of the delegates and trade exhibitors that had made bookings and we are very grateful for the strong show of support we have received for the 2021 conference.

Student Poster Competition

At the 2021 Extractive Industry Geology Conference there will be a Student Poster Competition – this is open to anyone currently studying a geoscience subject at a UK university and we require your help to ensure as


many students are aware of this as possible.

Students have the opportunity to write a 250 word abstract on a subject related to their studies that particularly interests them or they would work well poster. No new research is required for this (unless they want to of course), so if they wish to use a past or current piece of work such as their project or thesis they are more than welcome. Abstracts are required to sent be Stuart to Kightley (skightley@googlemail.com) by the 31st January 2021.

A small panel made up of industry professionals will then choose the 5 best abstracts and invite the student to design and print their posters and attend the EIG 2021 Conference (attendance fees will be paid for) where their poster will be displayed.


At the conference each student will get 5 minutes to present their poster before the EIG audience who will then vote for their favourite, the student gaining the most votes will receive a £100 prize!

As well as the opportunity to win the prize, this gives all students a deeper understanding of an industry they may wish to work in; the opportunity to meet representatives of the industry (and potential future employers); the chance to improve their professional profile and CV and finally the enjoyment of meeting likeminded people!



















EIG Webinar Series

The postponement of the EIG Exeter conference to 2021 was a sad but necessary response to the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic. The EIG organisers were keen to create something to bring together the EIG community and the EIG Webinar was born!

Our plan is to host a monthly webinar on Zoom until the EIG Exeter conference in July 2021. These will be facilitated by the current EIG chairperson Teresa Brown with EIG secretary Clive Mitchell behind the Zoom controls. The webinars start at midday with a 30 minute talk and 30 minutes for a Q&A session.

We started on 17th June 2020 with an excellent talk by David Payne from the Mineral Products Association on "The UK Mineral Strategy". This was prerecorded and broadcast via Zoom at the webinar – unfortunately the sound quality via Zoom for the recording was not great. We followed with a live Q&A session.
